VESTIBULAR WORKSHOP

SASLHA Western Cape would like to invite you to attend this workshop open to anybody wishing to improve their knowledge on this topic prior commencement of the Vestibular certification course taking place in January 2009.

Presenter: Christine Rogers

Christine is an audiologist and lecturer at the University of Cape Town and has been in clinical practice at Groote Schuur Hospital for more than 25 years. She has a special interest in vestibular assessment and management, and established the first multi-disciplinary clinic in sub-Saharan Africa.

Christine has lectured extensively both locally and abroad. She has been invited to present papers at many conferences and has recently been asked to present vestibular grand rounds at two international audiology meetings. Her interest has moved from diagnosis to holistic management of all aspects of the dizzy patient, and in particular psychological issues that dizzy patients face. She has been instrumental in promoting and supporting vestibular rehabilitation therapy in the allied health community; as well as spreading awareness in the medical arena. She was made an honorary member of the Vestibular Disorders Association (VEDA) of the United States in recognition of her work. Through her work with VEDA she has successfully treated many patients via the Internet, including a cameraman in Kenya who became dizzy while filming the big cats!

Christine has an M.Sc. (Audiology) from the University of Cape Town, which was awarded for her work investigating the links between ototoxicity and Benign Paroxysmal Positional Vertigo. She is currently preparing for her Ph.D. which will investigate illness beliefs in vertigo patients. She has published articles in scientific journals and is a reviewer for a journal. Other areas of interest are functional disorders; advanced diagnostics and tinnitus assessment and management. Christine has an interest in complementary medicine and has a first degree in Reiki, as well as having completed a course in Shiatsu. She has been fortunate enough to be able to combine a love of travel with her work and recently lectured at the University of Hong Kong on the psychological aspects of vestibular disorders.

ADVANCED LEVEL II – NEURODEVELOPMENTAL THERAPY COURSE

The management of feeding, drinking and respiratory problems in children with cerebral palsy and related conditions.

This course is open to therapists who have completed the 8-week basic N.D.T./Bobath course.

The emphasis will be on the use of the ICF framework in assessment and intervention plus setting Goal Attainment Scaling (GAS) in paediatric rehabilitation. Various assessment protocols will be evaluated in terms of usefulness as outcome measures in support of evidence-based practice. Participants will engage in problem solving complex cases and in refining practical handling skills aimed at impacting respiratory function, eating and drinking. Inter- and transdisciplinary management of the targeted problems will form part of workshops, discussions and problem solving.
