Early Communication Intervention can make a significant difference if children are identified early and when intervention can be provided with the full participation of primary caregivers. Due to the advantage of neuroplasticity, early intervention is the most effective form of treatment for audiologists and speech-language therapists.

Course Contents and Target Audience

The seminar will focus on new tools and approaches to be used in clinical practice of early communication intervention within the different South African contexts where audiologists and speech-language therapists work.

The target audience is speech-language therapists, audiologists, occupational therapists, nurses and early childhood educators.

Early Communication Intervention is a transdisciplinary field where audiologists and speech-language therapists not only share roles, but each discipline also contributes uniquely to services directed at families with infants and preschool children with feeding difficulties, hearing loss and disorders, established and emerging communication disorders, or those who are at risk of developing difficulties in these areas. Diagnostic assessments remain discipline-specific, but family-centred intervention requires shared expertise.

It is a very challenging field, trying to understand the underlying developmental disabilities and overlapping conditions that young children present with, and the many factors contributing to a family's response to having a child developing differently from others.
